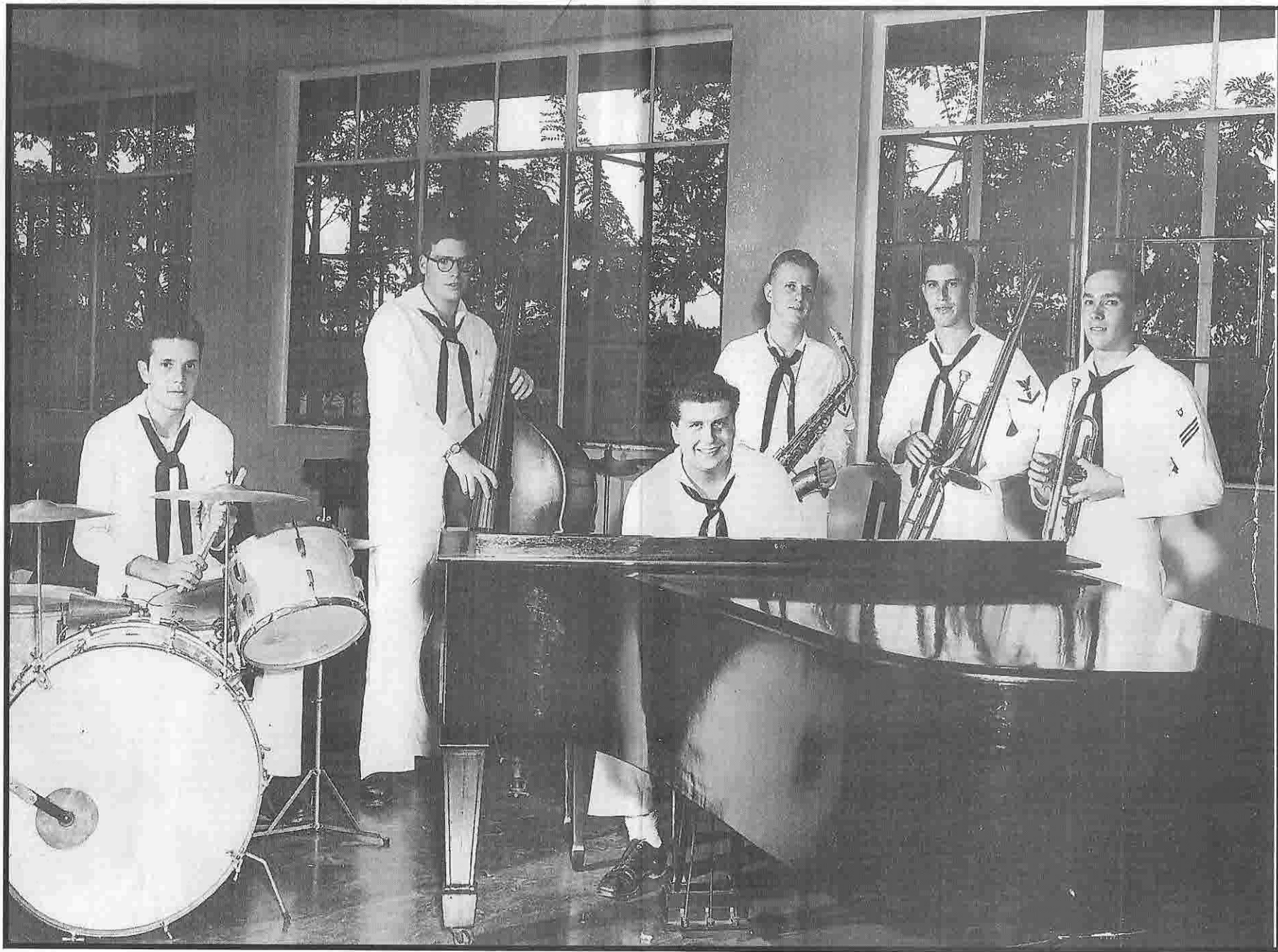
DIRECTIONS TO HOLIDAY INN EXECUTIVE CENTER

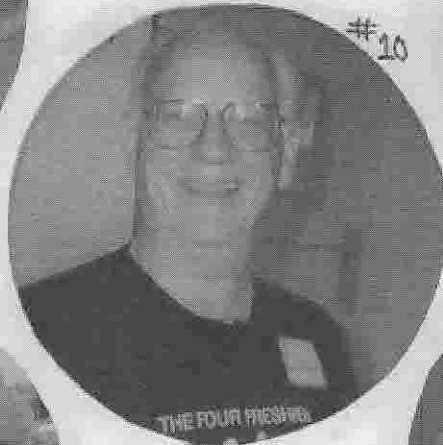
